### Biographical/Historical note

Raymond E. Plagge was born September 07, 1927 in Deerfield, IL. He joined the Marines in March 1943 and was sent to San Diego, CA. He was at Camp Elliot for 3 months and then transferred in Sept. 1943 to Camp Pendleton He was assigned to K Co. 3rd Bn, 24th Marines, 4th Division. He landed on Roi-Namu, Kwajaelen Atoll, went back to Mau, then on to Saipan. After the mop up on Saipan was finished and they were resting, he was admitted to the hopspictal for an infected ankle. He missed the landing on Tinian, but was able to rejoin K Co. to prepare for Iwo Jima. He was wounded on the beach of Iwo Jima and sent to Guam and rejoined K Co. in Maui. He was discharged in Nov 1945 and received the Presidential Unit Citation with 2 stars, the Purple Heart, and the Asiatic-Pacific with 4 stars. Raymond retired as power plan superintendent from University of Wisconsin-Superior in September 1989. Later in life, Raymond become very active with the 4th Marine Division Association. He attended yearly reunions, including a trip back to Iwo Jima. He also started a newsletter, "In Touch" to keep his fellow marines in contact with each other. Raymond died on Tuesday, April 8th, 2014, at the age of 86, at St Luke's Hospice in Duluth, Minnesota.

Leland Plagge was born in 1923. Leland entered the service in 1942. He trained at Camp Pickett in Virginia and then went to the European Theatre with the Company A, 398th Infantry Regiment, 100th Infantry Division. He was a Private First Class upon his death in April 1945 in Odheim, Germany. He was awarded the Silver Star (posthumously) for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in action against the enemy while serving with Company A, 398th Infantry Regiment, 100th Infantry Division, in action at Odheim, Germany, during World War II.

## **Scope and Contents note**

The manuscript component of the collection primarily consists of war correspondence between Raymond and Leland Plagge with their mother (and father). Leland wrote the bulk of the letters and spoke about training camp, meeting girls on leave (and wondering why they want to get so serious, so quick). Once Leland is overseas, his letter become visibly more depressed. He describes several near misses in his last letter. He dies sometime in the next month, in April 1945. Raymond also writes home, although not as faithfully. The letters are organized in chronological order.

The second part of the manuscript collection consists of Raymond's military activities in later life. He was very active in reunions and keeping in touch with his fellow marines. The bulk of the correspondence is with his fellow retired soldiers. He worked very hard to make connections with them and keep people in touch.

The audiovisual component of the collections consists of 17 photos, the bulk of which are from Raymond's WWII service. There are also some photos of military personnel in Korea and one photo of Raymond's father, Harold Plagge on a Deerfield Fire Department truck.
