Abstract: The Bong archives include military records, correspondence, photographs, scrapbooks, Bong Memorial items, newspaper clippings, magazines, books, films.

History: Born September 24, 1920 in Superior, WI. He enlisted in the Army Air Forces in 1941 as a flying cadet. After training at Rankin Aeronautical Academy in California, he went to Luke Field in Arizona for advanced training. He stayed on at Luke Field as an instructor for several months before being transferred to Hamilton Field in California for P-38 training. He went overseas in September 1942 and was assigned to the 9th Fighter Squadron, 49th Fighter Group. He quickly amassed 5 "kills" and became an Ace. He would go on to eventually surpass 26 kills, the WWI record of Eddie Rickenbacker. At this point he was sent home on leave as well as a war bond promotional tour. As the leading WWII Ace, he was very well-known at home. In April 1944 he was assigned additional gunnery training at Foster Field, Texas. In September 1944, Bong returned to his assignment with the 5th Fighter Command in the Pacific and was placed in charge of gunnery training with that organization. In addition to his duties as gunnery instructor, though not required or expected to perform combat duty, he voluntarily flew 30 more combat missions over Borneo and the Philippine Islands, destroying 12 more enemy aircraft, bringing his total to 40 enemy destroyed. For his achievements during this 3rd tour of overseas

duty, Major Bong was awarded this country's highest decoration, the Medal of Honor. He was released from his assignment with the 5th and returned to the U.S. in December 1944.

Upon his return, he married girlfriend Marge Vattendahl in February 1945. While in the Pacific, Bong had placed her picture on his plane and she too became a media favorite and in Major Bong's words was "the most shot at girl in the Pacific". He was assigned as test pilot at Wright-Patterson Airfield in Ohio and was later transferred to Burbank, CA and given an assignment as Chief of Flight Operations, Office of the Army Air Force Plant Representative, in the Lockheed Aircraft Plant. It was here that he began work as test pilot on the new P-80 jet aircraft, the first U.S. jet technology. He was killed on August 6, 1945, when the P-80 he was flying crashed near Burbank due to power failure, reasons unknown. He was buried in the cemetery family lot in his hometown of Poplar, WI on August 8, 1945.

Soon after his death, a committee was formed to build a Memorial to Major Bong in Poplar, Wisconsin. A small memorial room stood in the local school for approximately 50 years as well as having a P-38 outside the school given to the local American Legion by the Air Force in 1949. The plane was fully restored in the 1990's and now is the centerpiece of the Richard I Bong Veterans Historical Center in Superior, Wisconsin.

Scope and Content: The Richard Bong Collection includes childhood memorabilia, military records and paperwork, correspondence, scrapbooks. The strength of the collection is found with the correspondence, newspaper clippings series, and military records. These series give a historical overview of the life of Richard Bong as well as the efforts to keep his memory alive following his tragic and early death.

The *correspondence* series ranges from 1941-2006 and includes correspondence Dick Bong to family, Marge Bong to family, and items related to Bong Memorial.

The *newspaper clippings* series contains a wide range of articles on Richard Bong, Marge Bong and the Heritage Center

The *scrapbooks* include 4 of Marge's personal scrapbooks dated from WWII, Memorial scrapbooks, and Bong family scrapbooks of newsclippings.

BOX 6

Scrapbook's compiled by Marge Vattendahl (1926–1965)

The collection consists of 4 scrapbooks compiled by Marge Vattendahl from 1944-1945. Filled with newspaper clippings about Richard Bong's exploits in the Pacific as well as memorabilia from her courtship with Dick. Some of the artifacts in the album include menus, movie tickets, matchbooks. Many of these also include handwritten comments by Marge documenting where and when they were accumulated. She kept contributing to the albums through their wedding in February 1945 and also includes fabric samples from her veil and dress.

The scrapbooks were left in the care of her brother Lowell Vattendahl, who donated them to the museum in 2015. Acid free, thin leaf paper has been placed between pages containing items especially susceptible to acidification and decay.

Also included in this box is scrapbook compiled by the Bong family. It consists of copies of stories about Richard Bong from various books. The last few pages document Marge's life immediately after Dick's death from 1945-1946. Included is a copy of a print ad that features Marge as model.

BOXES 7-8-9

The collection consists of a total of 21 scrapbooks, of which 16 were compiled by the Bong family documenting Dick's life, death, and commemorative events through the early 2000's. They consist mostly of newspaper clippings, but also some letters and programs from commemorative events. They document the 1955 Poplar Memorial dedication, Airport dedication, proposed Bong AFB, General Kenney's death, Bong Memorial robbery, Bong bridge dedication, Aviation Hall of Fame induction, USPS stamp, P-38 Fund, Bong Heritage Center.

There are 2 scrapbooks compiled by the Bong Family that were part of the Bong Memorial room in Poplar. The first book consists of newspaper clippings documenting Dick Bong's career, marriage, and death. The second documents commemorative events after his death including the Historical Marker in Poplar, the School Forest, Memorial Dedication, UWS Hall of Fame.

There are 3 additional scrapbooks. One, put together by Delores Bjerga, consists of newspaper clippings following Dick Bong's career. The second was put together in 1984 by students in the Superior school system. It was cataloged into their library for many years before being donated to the Center. The third, compiled by a local family includes newsclippings about Dick's career, wedding, and death.
