
ROOTS IN BLUE ROCKED

She lived every bit of her 99 years, mowed her own lawn until 98 and was unhappy when her privileges were revoked. Jerry (Bong) Fechtelkotter was an amazing person, and much missed by all here at the Richard I. Bong Veterans Historical Center.

Jerry was the daughter of Carl and Dora Bong and a lifelong resident of Poplar. Little sister of our Ace of Aces, Her memory of the "good old days" was strong and she regaled us with many stories about the family growing up, like when she was Marge's maid of honor at their wedding.

We are especially grateful that she was involved in the announcement of the exciting news about finding her brother's "Marge" plane in Papua New Guinea. She was thrilled with the discovery and being able to share that with her made the experience even more special for everyone involved in the expedition.

Jerry married Lyle J. Fechtelkotter on August 26, 1949. They celebrated fifty-six years of marriage before Lyle passed in 2005. Jerry was an elementary school teacher for almost 40 years almost all in Maple WI. She enjoyed teaching first graders to read and write and develop a love of books.

Jerry and Lyle raised registered beef cattle with their kids. She was an active member of her community her entire life. Volunteering for Peace Lutheran church, singing in the choir, and working with quilters. She and Lyle were members of the International Lions Pin Trading Club and travelled the world trading. This tiny dynamo was a skilled seamstress, painted, did woodworking, was a sports fan,was an avid reader, animal lover and gardener.

She gave life her all and her friends and family even more. She will be severly missed.




